- 1. The scope of this bibliography compared with the last bibliography for 1961-5 has been extended to include more general works on the Maori and local histories which usually devote some space to Maori history. Works published in 1965 which were omitted from the last bibliography have been included. Four typescript Library School bibliographies (though falling outside the period) have been included. Three are bibliographies of archaeological literature and the fourth is of literature relating to the Maori use of bowenite and nephrite. These bibliographies are intended as assignments to be completed by students at the Library School. They are useful guides and their existence should be known.
- 2. The bibliography is not exhaustive but it should be a fair guide to the work published within the period. The compiler would like to know of any published work within the period not included in the bibliography. Such material will be included in the bibliography for 1968.
- 3. General descriptive annotations have been supplied for some monographs; for others only the section of interest has been noted. Lack of knowledge and time has prevented the compiler from making critical evaluations of the works which appear.
- 4. Articles appearing in the <u>N.Z.A.A. Newsletter</u> are excluded as this periodical is adequately indexed. The compiler has relied on the <u>Index to New Zealand Periodicals</u> published by the National Library of New Zealand to which due acknowledgment is made.
