ICOMIS NEW ZEALAND

There is a growing concern internationally over the need to recognise and conserve significant cultural landscapes. One initiative was the Cultural Landscapes Colloquium sponsored by the International Council on Monuments and Sites held in Montreal last May and the decision from the meeting to develop a broad network of national cultural landscape committees.

The first Australasian issue of the ICOMOS Landscape Working Group Newsletter has just been published which includes a paper on Archaeological Landscape Conservation in New Zealand by Aiden Challis as well as papers on the Auckland Garden History Society, the Auckland Domain Plan, Tongariro National Park, Canterbury landscapes, and papers relating to Australian cultural and historic landscapes.

The authors of the New Zealand content are now actively seeking contributions on paper towards a new venture - a local Cultural Landscape Newsletter, possibly produced jointly with Australia. They would welcome donations of \$15 to cover postage and photocopying from anyone - not necessarily ICOMOS members - who would like to be on the mailing list. Several other proposals are also being considered such as the setting up of the joint Australian and New Zealand Network in an electronic form using E-Mail, and a global electronic Newsletter as a Bulletin Board to be based in New Zealand.
