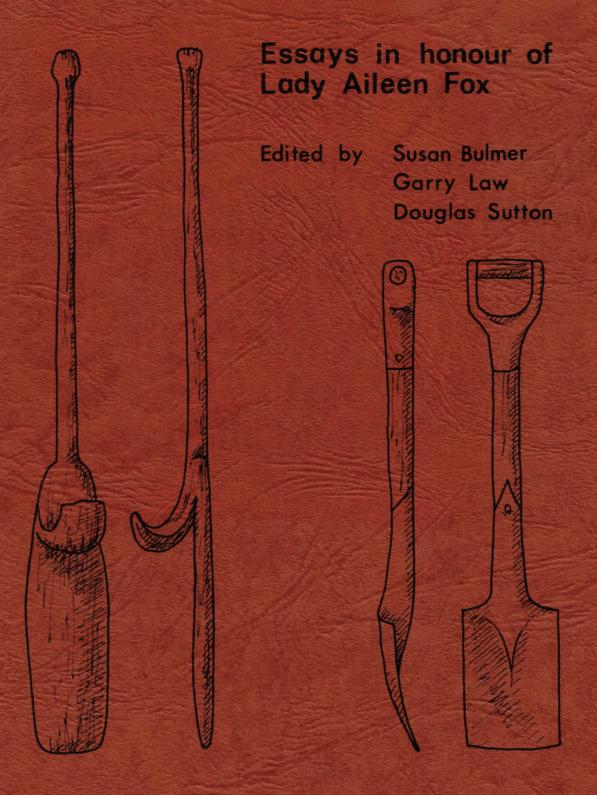

Preface

The editors like to think this volume offered in honour of Lady Aileen Fox's contribution to New Zealand archaeology reflects the breadth of her interests. The papers have been grouped to show this. Following Janet Davidson's and Mary Jeal's personal notes there are four papers (Bulmer, Jones, Spencer and Phillips) on paa, the very reason for her first interest in New Zealand. After these are four papers (Anderson, Butts, Harsant and Leach) on artefacts, a subject of study to which Aileen has made her own contribution. The papers by Sutton and Lawlor on habitation and storage structures are in keeping with the study of the structures found within sites which has engaged Aileen's attention. Finally the papers by Clarke and Prickett are reviews of regions, which while not ones in which Aileen has been active are the output of attempts to synthesise information, and write regional summaries of the state of knowledge; both in Aileen's view admirable pursuits, of which she has created many examples.

Readers will note some Maori words rendered with double vowels to indicate the length of vowel sounds, as is advocated by some. This causes considerable consistency problems. Proper names and Maori words in figure captions have been left in their usual form, lacking vowel length indication. Otherwise the form preferred by the author has usually been followed.

Some abbreviations used in the text may not be familiar to some.
