RECENT REPORTS

Bain, P. and H. Hovell 1993. East Coast Forestry Project: archaeological survey. East Coast Conservancy, Department of Conservation. 85 pp.

Results of an archaeological programme set up to identify and protect sites on potential afforestation blocks on the East Coast.

Bristow, P. 1993. An archaeological assessment of the proposed mining at German Hill, Ida Valley, Central Otago. Department of Anthropology, University of Otago. 39 pp.

Gold was discovered at German Hill in 1864 and large numbers worked the area for a short time. Some mining continued in subsequent decades. Water races, tailings, huts and ditch and bank fences recorded.

Campbell, M and P. Bristow n.d. [1993] Report on the salvage excavation at German Hill (S134/33) in the Ida Valley, Central Otago. Department of Anthropology, University of Otago. 21 pp.

Mapping and limited excavations were undertaken in the vicinity of the ruins of a stone building on the German Hill goldfield. Evidence of smithing found in one area.

Challis, A. and A. Walton 1993. An archaeological survey of the margins of the Pouerua volcanic apron. Department of Conservation. 13 pp.

A survey of the margins of the Pouerua volcanic apron was undertaken for the New Zealand Historic Places Trust in late 1992. Stone heaps and mounds were found on most parts of the apron along with evidence of settlement in the form of pits, terraces, and stone-edged hearths.

Maingay, J. 1993. James Callaghan's Tannery: A 19th Century Industry In The Bay Of Islands. Northland Conservancy, Department of Conservation. 100 pp.

Excavations at Pompallier House in Russell in 1987 and 1988 revealed tanning pits and a range of artefacts associated with James Callaghan's tannery which operated from the 1840s to the 1860s.
