RECENT REPORTS

Mosen, G. 1993. Cultural Heritage Inventory: A Base Inventory For The Franklin District. ARC Environment Division Technical Publication 31. 288 pp.

A preliminary inventory of heritage sites in Franklin District, compiled from existing sources. Report includes distribution maps, an extensive bibliography, and lists of archaeological sites, historic buildings, and historic trees.

Slocombe, A. 1993. An archaeological survey of the Far North. Northland Conservancy Historical Series 2, Department of Conservation. 61 pp.

Report describes a survey and assessment of sites in the sand dunes of the Far North from Waioropupunua Stream in the west to Parengarenga Harbour in the east. Over 100 new groups of features, mostly extensive midden and ovens, were recorded.

Young, A. 1993. Archaeological evidence at Mataia. Bioresearches, Auckland. 32 pp.

Survey of an area adjacent to Kaipara Harbour with evidence of a pa, storage pits, and midden.

Young, A. 1993. Bethlehem Heights archaeological assessment *and* Bethlehem Heights archaeological assessment 3: results of monitoring of the south eastern ridge. Bioresearches, Auckland. 13 and 19 pp respectively.

Survey of a proposed residential subdivision near Tauranga and monitoring of part of the area during earthmoving. Midden was the main form of evidence uncovered.

Young, A. 1993. Huntingdon Estate and St Andrews archaeological assessment. Bioresearches, Auckland. 19 pp.

Survey of two proposed residential subdivisions near Tauranga.

Young, A. 1993. Curries Farm archaeological appraisal. Bioresearches, Auckland. 5pp.

Survey of an area at Whitford near Auckland.
