RECENT REPORTS

Best, S. and M. Turner. 1997. *The Hall house site, Russell (Q05/1200). Archaeological Investigations*. Report for Department of Conservation, Northland Conservancy. 79 pp.

Results of a small scale excavation in 1995 in part of old Russell. House piles located along with rubbish pits and an ceramic and glass assemblage which mostly dates to period 1860-1890.

Grouden, V. 1998. *Archaeological survey of part Mangatuna Quarry, Tolaga Bay, for Transit New Zealand*. 3 pp.

Survey of an area proposed for quarrying.

Harlow, D. 1998. *Howick Stockade. Stockade Hill, Howick Manukau City*. Report prepared for Manukau City Council. 19 pp.

Survey of earthworks of Howick Stockade of the early 1860s, with management recommendations.

Historic Resource Management Services. 1998. *Archaeological investigation report, pursuant to an authority under section 14 of the Historic Places Act 1993. No. 1995/49: (X14/40 Te Kaha, Eastern Bay of Plenty*. 41 pp.

Results of investigation of part of pa site. Area stripped with machinery and pits, postholes and fire hearths identified. Presence of maize cobs in one fire scoop indicates some occupation in 1820s or later.

Petchey, P.G. 1998. *City Forests Limited. McCrostie Block, Tokoiti Forest. Preliminary archaeological survey*. 19 pp.

Survey of an archaeologically little known area. Sod walls and old road lines are main historic features present in what has always been a remote area.
