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TANE ARCHAEOLOGICAL INDEX - VOLS 1-30

Tane is the Journal of the Auckland University Field Club. The first cyclostyled foolscap issue came out in 1948. In recent years Tane has come out as a substantial (273 page in 1984) printed journal of A5 format.

As the Field Club journal, Tane has always concentrated on reporting the results of scientific field work. Much of this has been carried out on Field Club trips to various parts of the northern North Island. In recent years successive issues have carried many items by ex-Field Clubbers who have formed themselves into the Offshore Islands Research Group.

I started getting Tane long before I came to Auckland as it seemed to be such an excellent journal of wide interests, with reports of a general descriptive nature on many interesting places. I was very envious of Auckland University having such an active club which brought botanists, geologists, zoologists and others together. (Otago University used to have such a club which unfortunately died in the late sixties).

For some reason, however, archaeology students do not seem to have been active in Field Club - at least in recent years and possibly before. Why is this? Do we see ourselves as remote from the interests of botanists, geologists etc? Has archaeology more book-learning and laboratory work than these other disciplines? I think archaeology students are missing out on a great deal.

There have for all that been a number of archaeological contributions to Tane over the years. Many of these are by geologists, botanists and zoologists rather than by archaeologists. From them comes a substantial body of knowledge, especially concerning the northern offshore islands. Indeed, non-archaeologists have a much better record of reporting archaeological observations on northern offshore islands than have archaeologists who have been to these places. Most of this work is in the pages of Tane.
