THE CANTERBURY SURVEY

The Site Survey is young in Canterbury, and much of the recording to date has been done by myself and members of the Canterbury Museum's Archaeological Club, working as individuals.

None the less, most of North Canterbury and Kaikoura has been dealt with, some of Banks Peninsula has been done, and some sites have been recorded for Westland. South Canterbury has not been neglected either - much has been done there by Messrs. McCully and Irvine. Assistance to recording in South Canterbury is also being given by a survey of rock shelter drawings, currently in progress by the South Canterbury Regional Committee of the National Historic Places Trust.

Knowledge of the Canterbury Survey is growing, and there is now probably enough people interested in it to form a team, and so speed the progress of this urgent job.
