### THE SITE RECORDING SCHEME

This article is an expanded version of the author's report, as Central Filekeeper, to the 1972 Annual General Meeting of the Association. The article reports on the recent progress of the scheme and sets out general information on site recording for the assistance of members.

### PROGRESS OF THE SCHEME

Numbers of sites recorded in the past five years have been:

The large increase in sites recorded last year is encouraging, and shows a healthy activity in this field. Notable additions to the files have resulted from surveys of areas in Northland, Taranaki and the Wairarapa. In the Bay of Plenty, the filekeeper, Mr Ken Moore, has fulfilled a long cherished ambition to top four figures - the first filekeeper to do so. His satisfaction must be increased by the fact that most of the work has been his own.

As a result of the discussion at last year's conference, a full review of the site recording scheme was made by Council. Probably the

most important immediate result was the decision to convert the filing containers from manila envelopes to plastic envelopes. This enables the forms to be read without removal from the containers, and has been warmly welcomed by filekeepers. It has been possible to convert most local files and some central files.

Also as a result of this review, a new filing area was created in Nelson. This area covers 23 NZMS 1 sheets, and is under the care of Mr J. Y. Walls of Nelson.

Several minor adjustments have been made in the boundaries of filing districts, accounting for the unusual fluctuations in numbers in the table above.





Any Association member, and any other person, may consult files at the discretion of the local filekeeper. A duplicate set of files for all areas is kept in the office of the N.Z. Historic Places Trust, Wellington. These may be consulted with the permission of the Central Filekeeper.

Records may be sent to filekeepers at any time, typed on forms obtainable from filekeepers. The filekeeper will allot a number to each site.

### SITE RECORDING HANDBOOK

Full information on site recording and the site recording scheme is contained in "New Zealand Archaeology - A Site Recording Handbook" by J. R. S. Daniels. This book is obtainable from the Central Filekeeper, Box 3382, Wellington, at a cost of \$1.

### MAPS AND AERIAL PHOTOGRAPHS

These essential aids to recording are available to members of the Association at one-third discount from the Department of Lands and Survey. The Department has recently agreed that members may claim this discount at any map sales office on production of evidence of Association membership. A subscription receipt would be the best way of showing this. Purchases may also be made through the Central Filekeeper by forwarding the cost of the maps or photographs required, less discount but with the cost of postage added.

The discount price of NZMS1 and NZMS2 maps is 47 cents.
